

#### **Scholarships for High Placing Juniors in Fort Worth**

The THA Foundation has again committed to present scholarships to Texas Junior Hereford Association members exhibiting in the 2025 Jarold Callahan National Open Hereford Show in Fort Worth on February 3, 2025. These funds will be distributed to high placing juniors. To be eligible to receive these awards, the exhibitor must be a member of the TJHA and be eligible to show in the junior show the previous week (exhibitor does not have to exhibit at the junior show) and be at the halter of his/her heifer. No cow/ calf is eligible. The ownership rules for the junior show must be met as stated in the FWSSR premium book. ★

#### **Annual Membership Meeting** of the Texas Hereford **Association**





took a first-class flight at 4 pm, to a deserted O'Hare Air-







or Katie Jo Yates, the combination of Hereford cattle and working cattle on horseback sparked a love that led her to Rusty Day. This blossomed into a life centered on ranching, family, and success in the show ring. Together they've built a legacy rooted in their shared passions, while raising two sons eager to carry on the family cattle business.

Katie Jo and Rusty's journey began in the junior show circuits, as both their families were deeply involved in ranching and farming. Katie's first Hereford steers came from Tee Knox in Tarzan, Texas and Dale and Mary Barber of Barber Ranch in Channing, Texas. In that inaugural year of her show career, Dale gifted her a wooden show stick and encouraged her to always use a wooden stick when continued on page 30

showing Herefords—a tradition that stuck and has been passed down to their sons, Ryder and Riggin.

"Mr. Dale's advice left a lasting impression on me as an 8- or 9-year-old," Katie Jo recalled. "Lesia Schnitker gave Ryder his first wooden show stick when he was born and has crafted a couple more for the boys as they have grown. They've become a meaningful tradition for our family."

Growing up in Tarzan, Texas, Katie Jo showed other breeds but always held a special place in her heart for Herefords. Rusty, meanwhile, grew up showing crossbreds. Their paths often crossed in show rings across Texas, and their friendship evolved during college into a partnership—both in cattle and in life.

"When I was graduating college and preparing to start ranching, I found a set of cows to buy but didn't have

#### Day Hereford Steers Shine in National Western's Catch-A-Calf Program

Each year, Day Cattle Co. sends 30-35 of their predominantly Hereford steers to the National Western Stock Show's (NWSS) Catch-A-Calf program. The 2025 event will mark their fourth year of involvement in this unique youth initiative, which they describe as "a really neat opportunity for both the kids and us."

"This is similar to calf scramble programs in Texas," explained Katie Jo. "Youth catch a calf during the rodeo, but instead of receiving a monetary voucher, they are awarded a Hereford steer."

The Days became involved when Craig Huffhines, then CEO of the American Hereford Association, approached the Barber Ranch about sourcing calves for the NWSS program. Mary Barber referred him to the Days, and the partnership has

Every May, the Days transport 30-35 Hereford steers—castrated, dehorned, and halter-broken—to the NWSS grounds in Denver. These steers are paired with successful calf scramblers through a lottery system, made possible by sponsors

The selected youth take their steers home to raise and return to the NWSS in January to compete. The competition includes traditional showing, showmanship, record books, interviews, and even a carcass evaluation. NWSS also offers clinics throughout the year to help participants, many of whom are new to livestock care and showing, prepare for the program. The docile nature of Hereford steers has made them an excellent choice for beginners and families with limited experience.


"This partnership has been incredibly rewarding for us. We're passionate about supporting youth and agriculture," said Katie Jo. "Leon Vick, vice president of rodeo and horse show operations, who manages the program, works tirelessly to ensure each exhibitor has a positive experience."

Vick is quick to praise the Days and calls them "huge friends of the NWSS."

"Our experience with Katie Jo and Rusty has just been nothing but great. In the past we had issues with temperament. These are novice exhibitors, and they would just have trouble handling some of the steers. But these Hereford steers come to the kids in May ready for them to learn together. The Days see to it that these calves are docile, used to being on a halter and ready to be handled," said Vick.

The 2025 Catch-A-Calf competition will be held on January 11th. Since its inception in 1943, the program has awarded nearly 3,000 calves to young agricultural enthusiasts. It serves as a cornerstone of the NWSS, providing 4-H and FFA members with invaluable hands-on experience in beef cattle management. Through the guidance of their sponsors, participants learn the responsibility of raising their calves to market steers while fulfilling program requirements.

This long-standing initiative not only teaches practical skills but also instills a lifelong appreciation for agriculture, ensuring its future in the hands of dedicated youth.

#### **BOOSTER OF THE YEAR**

#### Colyer Herefords, Bruneau, Idaho

G uy Colyer began his registered herd as a 4-H project while growing up on his family's commercial Hereford ranch. In 1976, the same year he married his wife, Sherry, they purchased cattle from the Stone Hereford dispersion and BB Cattle Co. and the entire cow herd from Tom and Ardis Dashiell. Together, they built the ranch and cowherd to what it is today. Colyer Hereford and Angus in Bruneau, Idaho, consists of 300 registered Hereford cows and 75 replacement heifers and a large recipient herd. Guy's parents, the late Ray and Bonnie Colyer, began building the Angus herd in 1993 to provide two breeds for their commercial customers. The Colyer's have been producing ET calves since 1983, and now more than 90% of their calf crop is a result of artificial insemination (AI) or ET.

Always on the cutting edge, the Colyer's hosted the very first internet sale in 2003 to market their females. In October, they hosted their 23rd annual female sale and this coming February, the Colyer's will host their 45th annual bull sale. Their main objective is to produce a volume of range continued on page12

bulls, but they are also proud to have produced the world-record selling Hereford bull as well as owning four of the six Hereford bulls that have been two-time Denver champions.

A graduate of the University of Idaho's animal science department, Guy helped start its "Steer-A-Year" program. He was awarded the U.S. Livestock Industry Leader of the Year honor in 2017 by the National Western Stock Show. Colyer Hereford and Angus was recognized as the U.S. Senate Small Business of the Month for March 2018 on the Senate floor. Guy has represented the breed in many capacities, including having served on the AHA Board from 1992-1998. He served on the merger committee during that time and also chaired the nominating committee in 2006. He

attended the World Hereford Conference in Uruguay in 2017 and went on a trade mission to Mexico in 2018. Guy was inducted into the Hereford Hall of Fame in 2019.

Being major proponents of Hereford youth, the Colyer's have hosted the Idaho Junior State Hereford Field Day and Show for four years and the Northwest Regional Show for two years. They have also hosted the Faces of Leadership Conference, then known as PRIDE. Guy is quick to note Colyer Hereford and Angus is a family operation with everyone working together. He, Sherry, and their children, Kyle and Katie, along with and Kyle's children Piper and Cruz, all play an active role in keeping the operation at the forefront.

"You can find Guy driving around in his Jeep Cherokee chewing Redman while checking on cattle any given day, unless there is a Yankees game on TV," notes Aaron Wilbourn with W6 Herefords. "All kidding aside, Guy is an example of what I think a good cowman is. His family is his priority and what a great family he has."



#### THA HONORARY MEMBER

ark McClintock of San Angelo, Texas, will be awarded an Honorary Membership in the Texas Hereford Association (THA). A lifelong advocate of the Hereford breed, McClintock has played a significant role in its growing popularity across Texas.



Although McClintock's early years were spent near

a racetrack in Los Angeles, where his father worked as a horse trainer and jockey, he found his true passion with cattle rather than horses. He grew up showing cattle and later attended Cal Poly University, where he majored in animal science and was part of the livestock judging team. His career has taken him around the world, evaluating cattle of all types, and he has contributed to notable programs such as Bright Bros. Herefords in California, Lone Star Herefords in Texas, and spent nearly 30 years at Rocking Chair Ranch (RCR) in Texas.

After college, McClintock worked at Bright Herefords before moving to Texas as the herdsman for Lone Star Herefords. It was during this time, while showing cattle at the National Western Stock Show (NWSS), that he met his wife, Teresa. Together, they raised two sons, Ryan and Mason.

In the early 1980s, McClintock joined Rocking Chair Ranch, where he was charged with developing an elite Hereford herd. His efforts were rewarded in 1981 when he was named Hereford Herdsman of the Year. Over the next 25 years, McClintock helped establish the RCR herd, which achieved numerous accolades, including raising the grand and reserve champion horned females at the 2000 Junior National Hereford Expo and the reserve champion female at the NWSS. His work was also key in creating a market for RCR's bulls, selling Hereford sires to Brahman breeders to develop the Queen of the South cross.

In 2009, McClintock launched a consulting business, assisting Hereford breeders across the country with their marketing efforts while continuing to judge major cattle shows. His lifelong dedication to the breed remains steadfast and he continues to be an influential figure in the Hereford community.

This honorary membership is a testament to Mc-Clintock's tireless commitment to the Hereford breed and his significant contributions to its success in Texas and beyond.  $\bigstar$







1895 in Roberts County, known as John's Creek, four sections at a time and secured other land through dissolution of large ranches such as the Bar CC and the Hansford Land & Cattle Co. Bud's parents bought their first Herefords from Lee Bivins Family of Amarillo, Texas 1903. They engaged in commercial Hereford cow/calf, yearling/stocker, and feedlot operations.

In 1944 Bud and his nephews, Ben and Bill McIntire, and niece, Mary K. McIntire Christner, formed the Brainard Cattle Co. Bud would buy out his partners in 1990. Bud Brainard's Hereford cattle continue to roam the Canadian breaks as they did in the early days and the herd continues the standards of high quality that has been characteristic of Brainard cattle for over 100 years. Bud is in the American Hereford Association Hall of Fame.



#### **RANCHO VIESCA HEREFORDS - MARK ELLISON**


The Ellison family began raising registered Hereford cattle in the early 1930s. My grandfather and grandmother received a Hereford bull for their wedding gift from my grandmother's father. My grandfather, Carlton Wright Ellison, purchased his first registered females from the Texas A&M College registered herd in the early 1930s and members of our family have been raising Herefords in Milam County since then. We are now in our fifth generation of Hereford breeders and operate our herd as Rancho Viesca Herefords. We focus on producing seedstock that can thrive in Central Texas and that can meet the needs of our commercial cattlemen customers.

#### **NOACK HEREFORDS**




#### **POWELL RANCH**

#### **ROCKER b RANCH**

The history of the Bar S Ranch, later known as the Rocker b Ranch, showcases a legacy of innovation and growth in cattle ranching and horse breeding. Beginning in 1871, Philetus Sawyer acquired land along the Middle Concho River, and by 1887, the Sawyer Cattle Company was born following the acquisition of the Bar S Brand. As pioneers in West Texas ranching, they were the first to fence holdings and drill water wells. The ranch expanded from a single section to 172,000 acres by 1910, emphasizing quality Hereford cattle and horses under successive



leadership, including L.L. Farr, Sr., and Jr.

The ranch's influence extended beyond Texas, with notable acquisitions like the San Cristobal Ranch in New Mexico. Its reputation for quality breeding grew, registering its first AQHA horse in 1940. William A. Blakley's 1954 purchase introduced the Rocker b brand, which thrived under his leadership, culminating in its donation to the Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children in 1964.

Through decades, the ranch evolved with advancements in breeding practices, reintroducing registered Herefords in 2016 and emphasizing performance-based horse bloodlines. From its origins as a frontier operation to a modern-day ranch, the Rocker b Ranch remains a symbol of agricultural excellence.

#### Where's the Beef?

#### COURSE NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE

Legal, economic considerations for direct beef sales to consumer highlighted

by Paul Schattenberg, Texas AgriLife Today

Direct beef sales have skyrocketed across the country, and the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service offers an online course to help cattle producers explore this avenue of selling their beef.

The Where's the Beef?: Legal and Economic Considerations for Direct Beef Sales three-hour online course is designed for cattle producers, ranchers and others interested in direct selling. It's an abbreviated online version of the popular Where's the Beef? program that is presented in person at various locations throughout the state.

The course is designed to provide information that will allow participants to expand beef sales by learning about legal and economic considerations related to selling beef directly to the consumer.

The online course will be available for \$50 for the first 100 registrants and \$75 thereafter. It can be found on the AgriLife Learn site at https://agrilifelearn.tamu.edu/s/, using the product code AGEC-CO-032.

"Several hundred people have already participated in the course in person and 100% of them said they would recommend it to a friend," said Tiffany Lashmet, JD, AgriLife Extension agricultural law specialist with the Department of Agricultural Economics, who is based in Amarillo.

The course is being offered online since many people interested in direct beef sales cannot attend an in-person program or one might not be offered in their area.

#### About the direct beef sales course

Online course instructors are Lashmet; Davey Griffin, Ph.D., AgriLife Extension meat specialist and professor in the Department of Animal Science; and David Anderson, Ph.D., AgriLife Extension economist for livestock and food product marketing and professor in the Department of Agricultural Economics. A certificate of completion will be available at the end of the course.

Participants will learn:

- · Legal considerations for direct beef sales.
- · Economic considerations for direct beef sales.
- Permitting requirements.
- · Marketing avenues.
- · Labeling considerations.

It is presented in three modules:

- · Farm to Plate.
- Legal Considerations.
- · Economic Considerations.

Funding for the course is provided by the Southern Extension Risk Management Education Center. ★

The Texas Hereford Association is proud to honor Charles Smith for raising sound profitable, hardy registered and commercial Herefords in South Texas. And also proudly being a part of one of the oldest Hereford operations in Texas.

Smith Herefords is a fourth generation, family-owned ranch in George West, Texas. It got its start in 1914 when Sidney Smith of Beeville, Texas bought his first registered Herefords. Years later his son, Leonard C. Smith, returned home after graduating from Texas A&M University to expand the operation. Leonard was called back into active duty with the outbreak of World War ll leaving his father to operate the farm and ranch.

After returning home Leonard and his two sons, William (Bill) and Charles, grew the registered cattle herd to nearly 500 head and continued to grow their farming operation. By the mid-1960's Leonard Smith and sons had produced their own production sales at the ranch. Sidney died in 1974 at 101 years old, Leonard passed in 2006 at 102 years old. Both ranched up until their final days. Billy passed in 2020 leaving his son, Sidney Smith, to continue his ranching operation. Charles's wife, Sammie, were married 55 vears. In 2014 she had the desire to continue the family tradition and purchased the Grand and Reserve bred registered heifers at Fort Worth, to expand their genetic pool. Today Smith Herefords is operated by Charles and



Sammie's son, Ward, and is looking forward to the next generation!

In 1937 Sidney, Leonard and 28 other Hereford breeders in Bee and surrounding counties formed the South Texas Hereford Association which continues to hold consignment sales today. ★



#### Brooke Rollins Named Secretary of Agriculture

by President-elect Donald Trump


Brooke Rollins, President and CEO of the America First Policy Institute (AFPI), has been selected by President-elect Donald Trump to serve as the next Secretary of Agriculture. Announcing the appointment, Trump commended Rollins for her "unwavering dedication to American farmers, safeguarding U.S. food self-sufficiency, and revitalizing agriculture-dependent small towns."

A native of Glen Rose, Texas, Rollins leads AFPI, a think tank established by former Trump administration officials to advance conservative policies. Under her leadership, the organization has prioritized



initiatives such as limiting foreign ownership of U.S. farmland, particularly by Chinese entities—an issue that has garnered bipartisan support in Congress.

As Secretary of Agriculture, Rollins will oversee a department of over 100,000 employees and manage more than 3,000 county offices. Her responsibilities will encompass farm and nutrition programs, forestry, rural development, food safety, agricultural research, trade, and more. With a 2024 budget of \$437.2 billion, Rollins will also spearhead the administration's efforts to advise Congress on the Farm Bill.



Rollins has personal ties to agriculture; her four children are actively involved in cattle showing, including Herefords, reflecting her strong connection to rural communities.

Rollins has a distinguished career in conservative policy advocacy. From 2003 to 2018, she served as President and CEO of the Texas Public Policy Foundation (TPPF), transforming it into a nationally prominent think tank. During Trump's first term, she held key roles as Director of the Domestic Policy Council and Assistant to the President for Strategic Initiatives, shaping landmark domestic policies across multiple sectors.

Her extensive network within Trump's inner circle, including connections to figures like Jared Kushner, positions her strategically to address USDA priorities effectively. Before joining the Trump administration, Rollins served as an aide to then-Energy Secretary Rick Perry and led the Texas Public Policy Foundation.

Rollins earned a Bachelor of Science in Agricultural Development from Texas A&M University, graduating cum laude in 1994 and becoming the university's first female student body president. She later received her Juris Doctor from the University of Texas School of Law. Growing up on a Texas farm and serving as a Texas State FFA officer cemented her deep roots in agriculture.

Watch for a big announcement during the annual meetings of the Texas Junior Hereford Association and the Texas Hereford Association for monies that will be paid out to Hereford winners!







Per the Texas Cattle Feeders Association (TCFA) site: The TCFA Junior Fed Beef Challenge was designed to encourage young people to gain practical experience in feeding commercial beef cattle. This program stresses the importance of proper animal husbandry and financial management. Over the last 25 years, TCFA has introduced hundreds of young people to the cattle feeding industry through the Junior Fed Beef Challenge.

A new program for our junior members has been developed and approved by the Texas Hereford Association Executive Committee. The THA is teaming up with the TCFA and will be adding in award monies for three different divisions developed by THA. The three divisions for the steers will be 1) Registered Herefords 2) Commercial Hereford (at least 50% Hereford) and 3) Black or Red Baldy. The junior must be a TJHA member.

The established rules for the TCFA program will be followed and then the THA Foundation will add in the monies for qualifying steers. Things to note:

- · Calves are spring born calves
- Weaned in Sept / Oct @ 450 + lbs.
- Usually run on wheat pasture until March
- At March entry date calves should be weighing 8 - 900 lbs.
- Calves can be fed at home or a feedlot.
- At mid July delivery / slaughter steers are going to weigh about 1400 lbs.

Find complete information on the TCFA website and click on the youth tab. Breeders need to consider the advantage of selling your steers to these participants that will help promote your genetics. enough money," Rusty explained. "Katie offered to partner with me, and when that partnership worked, it led to marriage in 2004.

Katie Jo was equally thrilled. "When I realized Rusty wanted to raise Herefords and work cattle on horseback like my family did, I knew this was the life I wanted forever."

Today, the couple operate Day Show Cattle in Meadow, Texas, about 45 miles southwest of Lubbock. Their operation includes farming wheat, peanuts, milo, and hay crops, along with a focus on producing show steers for 4-H and FFA exhibitors. Their herd features a mix of registered Herefords and high-percentage Hereford crosses tailored for competitive club calf genetics.

Their steers have achieved remarkable success in junior show circuits. In 2020, their son Ryder's home-raised Polled Hereford steer won breed champion at the Fort Worth Stock Show & Rodeo (FWSSR) and went on to claim the overall grand championship, setting a FWSSR sale record at \$300,000 at the time. Fellow Hereford breeders, Gary and Kathy Buchholz of GKB Cattle purchased the steer.

Riggin has also shined in the show ring, exhibiting two Hereford breed champions at Fort Worth, while Day Cattle Co. steers claimed the Hereford and Polled Hereford division titles for customers at the 2024 FWSSR. Ryder and Riggin have shared victories, including both winning breed champions in Houston during the same yeara moment the family cherishes.

"That walk down to the Reliant Center floor together was breathtaking," Katie Jo said. "It was overwhelming to see what we had accomplished as a family."

While their personal wins are memorable, Rusty and Katie Jo prioritize the success of their customers. "Customer service is key," Rusty said. "We help with everything from nutrition to showmanship, grooming, and fitting, and we attend as many shows as possible to support our exhibitors."

Their dedication has earned them loyal customers, including families without ranching backgrounds drawn to the growing popularity of FFA and 4-H in suburban areas. It also has earned them a strong repeat customer base with families, who buy all their kids a Day bred steer. Day Cattle Co. markets 120-150 steers annually through a live auction, multiple online sales, private treaty, and a partnership with the National Western Stock Show's Catch-a-Calf program (See sidebar).

Rusty and Katie Jo credit their parents for instilling their strong work ethic and providing support that helped them grow their operation. Located near Rusty's family in Meadows, they've steadily acquired land and expanded their ranch.

Their sons, Ryder, a high school senior, and Riggin, a freshman, are following in their footsteps. Both have a shared goal of continuing the family legacy after college. The family has always looked at their showing as a business, also.

"Winning Fort Worth was a tremendous blessing, and we're committed to stewarding that success wisely," Rusty said. "The boys have college funds, plus have purchased some land near us and have started building their own herd. Their operation has grown to the point they now have a few calves in our sales.'

Katie Jo added, "It's a joy to see their passion for ranching remain strong. Watching them grow in this life is the greatest reward."

From the beginning, the Days have lived by their motto: Work hard, win big. But for them, the "win" isn't about trophies and banners—it's about the life lessons gained through hard work and perseverance.

"To us, it's the experiences and values learned with a show steer that truly matter," Katie Jo emphasized.

For Rusty and Katie Jo, a day spent working red-and-white-faced cattle on horseback isn't just a scene from a movie-it's the life they've chosen to live together. And for their family, it's the perfect life. \*


