















His calves are born usually 7 to 9 days early, and they hit the ground growing. Calves are currently registered in 20 herds from Tennessee to Idaho.



attlemen are well aware of their responsibility to grow good grass, raise quality livestock and their ability to coexist with wildlife in the area, but there is a whole other species requiring management that may not cross the mind as frequently.

Parasites in cattle are less visible, but still an important area requiring attention that cattleman can add to their résumé of management and while they are certainly less glamorous than cattle or deer on the wide-open land, parasites must be managed to keep cattle and grasses healthy.

Parasites, by definition, are an organism that harms their host and cattle are no exception. When found in livestock, they will reduce the overall weight gain of the animal because the desire for grazing is decreased (reducing dry matter intake) and parasites reduce the ability to digest nutrients because of the inflammation in their stomach if it is an internal parasite.

Dr. Lee Jones, veterinarian for the University of Georgia, said, "Parasites impact animal health and can compromise the host's immune system and potentially decrease the effectiveness of vaccinations and other herd health measures, leaving your livestock to be susceptible to disease and creating an economic impact on your operation's budget."

He added that when the animal is not gaining weight, the producer has less pounds of beef to sell and heifers *continued on page 19*

impacted by parasites will experience delayed puberty. "Females that experience delayed breeding due to parasites will potentially have reduced longevity. When the female does not stay in the herd long enough to replace her development costs, it is another expense that producers can add to their list."

Managing for internal and external parasites may look different, but the need remains the same and the operation's bottom line depends on it.

Typically, producers in the southeast are impacted by internal parasites, like liver flukes, lung worms, coccidia and hairworms, which are more prevalent in the cooler months (the heat creates unfavorable circumstances for survivable).

While the cold can kill the parasite larvae, the larvae find protection in manure and survive by taking shelter in manure pats.

"Cattle acquire an internal parasite by grazing and ingesting infective larvae. A parasite larvae will only climb about four-to-five inches up the plants," Dr. Jones explained, "When you enter the fall months and have short pastures, we see issues because the cattle are grazing the grass at that shorter height verses the summer months when the grasses grow higher than the larvae can climb."

Rotational grazing can be the management tool to help prevent cattle from ingesting parasite larvae, along with ensuring accurate stocking rates to allow grass to

grow at appropriate levels.

"You want to keep your pastures at five-to-six inches high and consider a deworming program that includes every calf receiving a dewormer," Dr. Jones continued, "I always recommend every animal under two years of age be dewormed regularly, which will not only support growth, but may help improve fertility in replacement females." continued on page 20



early June and again in November/December. However, rainfall can impact the deworming schedule. Internal parasites need moisture for survival and thus, areas with more rainfall are more susceptible to parasites than dry areas. "We need to reconsider routine overuse of our dewormers and past practices. Internal parasites have developed resistance to commonly used dewormers and practices. This means we need to develop new strategies and practices to maintain effective parasite control programs in our herds," he said.

Lice – both biting and blood-sucking – are transmitted through contact between cattle and usually in the winter months... External parasites (horn flies, lice and grubs) also pose a problem and require vigilant management. Much like internal parasites, with proper preventative treatments and processes, external parasites can be controlled.

On that note, Dr. Jones cautions against using a single dewormer and recommends an injectable and oral dewormer, given at the same time (a full dose of each) to ensure proper management. Historically, dewormers have been recommended twice a year, once in late May/



Horn flies peak in late spring after reproducing in fresh cattle manure and decrease in population by mid-summer due to the heat. Because thousands of horn flies can take up residence on one animal, your livestock may experience reduced energy and nervousness while the horn flies suck blood, irritate the animal, and create negative impacts on weight gain. Insecticides, pour-ons, dust chemicals and spot-on chemicals are a options cattlemen have to treat these pesky parasites. Self-treatment options also include oil back rubbers, dust bags and tubes and ear tags.

Lice – both biting and blood-sucking – are transmitted through contact between cattle and usually in the winter months, when cattle are in close proximity for warmth, leading to a lice infestation within the herd. If severe, cattle infected with lice could develop a condition known as Lousy, which is an itching skin disease associated with anemia. To stay ahead of the game and prevent and/or treat lice within your herd, consider administering insecticides every two weeks and/or use spray, dust, spot-on or pour-on treatment methods.

Rounding out the list of common external parasites are grubs, which are the larvae of heel flies. They lay their eggs on the hairs of the lower legs of cattle in the late winter and spring and migrate from there to cover the backs of cattle. This leads to weight loss and reductions in milk production. Much like horn flies and lice, insecticides can be administered along with pour-ons, dust and sprays.

Parasites are a nuisance for the livestock and a detriment to your bottom line. While they aren't large in size, they are harmful to your production and should be a key line in your management plan, for the benefit of the herd and your financials. \bigstar






