

Look Xob

Celebrating 125 years of The Texas Hereford Association

s we continue our look back into history, this article will focus on some of the first herds of Herefords in Texas and the growth that led to the formation of the Texas Hereford Association (THA).

In 1890, there were seven members in the American Hereford Association (AHA) in Texas, although there were cattle registered to others. By 1900, there were 78 members of the AHA in Texas and the THA had been formed.

As we told you last month, Captain William S. (Sude) Ikard is credited with bringing the first Herefords to Texas, but he wasn't alone and was soon joined by others. It is important to note that many of the cattle imported into the state were lost to tick fever, but the pioneers persevered.

Lee & Reynolds were buyers of buffalo robes, Indian traders, and freighters, along with army beef contractors. They had multiple locations, but thee established a ranch on the Canadian River near the Texas New Mexico line. They introduced Hereford bulls in 1878 or 1879. They would be credited as producing the first Texas bred Hereford in 1881.

William Powell, an Illinois breeders would move his herd to Texas and for a short time partnered with B.C. Rhome. They would raise cattle in Rhome, Texas. Later Powell would set up an outfit in Channing, Texas.


O.H. Nelson gets most of the credit for establishing Herefords in the Panhandle. In 1883, he took between 500-600 head of young cows and 20 Hereford bulls to Swisher County, Texas, near Tulia. The females were mostly of Shorthorn breeding, but there were some that were half to three-quarters Hereford. This herd would be sold soon after to Col. Charles Goodnight and became the foundation for the noted JJ and JA herds, owned by Mrs. C. Adair. Goodnight and Adair would also add some cattle from a large importation of Herefords from England in 1883.

In 1889, XIT Ranch had 3,000,000 acres in the Panhandle and were

looking for purebred bulls and Herefords were the first to be purchased for this historic outfit.

Scharbauer Bros in 1892 established a Hereford herd near Midland, Texas. One of the bulls they utilized carried Anxiety 4th breeding. They grew to be one of the largest populations of registered Herefords in the country.

J.C. Stribling founded a herd of Hereford in Llano in 1897. One of the early herds in South Texas was that of J.W. Co0k & son at Beeville. The Lees Bros. near San Angelo started raising Herefords in the late 1890's and 1898, Mark Hovenkamp, Fort Worth introduced Polled Hereford bulls into his herd, and is considered the first to do that in Texas.

329 members and was fifth in membership in the country. They maintained that position until 1924 when they moved up to fourth place. According to the government census in 1930, there was a total of 448,767 registered Herefords nationwide. Texas was home to 94,951 of those or 21 percent and that garnered the Lone Star State

fords were being sent across the Rio Grande into Mexico during this time and there were two large exportations of Herefords made from Tex-

The Unknown Hereford Bull

Excerpt from The Hereford Journal, October 1936

A few years ago, the writer in an article in The Hereford Journal suggested that a monument should erected to the "Unknown Hereford Bull" that started the revolution of the beef cattle industry in Tewwxas. He wrote the following:

"The state of Texas owes it to the memory of the leader of this memorable invasion of its soil to do something handsome in his honor. The arrival of the first Hereford bull was one of the most important events in the state's history, comparable with the establishment of independence of Mexico and its admission into the union.

The first Whiteface invader, looking out over the vast empire which he was to make his own, was the forerunner of a host that was to sweep down across the broad plains and up over the wide tablelands of the state, and revolutionize the industry that played the leading part in the early development of the commonwealth. The Hereford bull was to double and triple the value of the millions of acres of grazing land that never could have much value save for the production of beef. He was to make two or three pounds of beef grow where one pound grew before. He was to bring in his wake thousands of miles of railroad built largely for the purpose of carrying to market the wealth he produced. He was to lay the foundation for vast fortunes which were to employ in the building of cities and the development of the varied and rich natural resources of the state.

Many individuals, who contributions to the good of mankind were not comparable to that of the Hereford bull to the welfare of Texas have had monuments erected to their memory by grateful posterity. The fact that this first Hereford bull to tread the soil of Texas remains nameless need not prevent the common-



wealth which he so greatly benefitted from showing its gratitude. Why not a monument to the "Unknown Hereford Bull" that led the conquest of the beef herds of Texas?"

as. The largest and most notable was in 1914 by Murdo Mackenzie of the Matador Land & Cattle Co., who was at that time general manager of the Brazil Land, Cattle & Packing Co. of Sao Paulo, Brazil. He took 500 registered Hereford bull calves selected from Texas herds that were below the quarantine line because cattle in Brazil were infested with a fever tick like the one formerly prevalent in a large part of Texas. The second large exportation was made in 1920, when the government of the Philippines purchased 100 head (bulls and females) for distribution n in their islands. ★





Before anything else, preparation is the key to success," Alexander Graham Bell said. While he wasn't thinking of beef producers per se when he shared that wisdom, it doesn't change the direct correlation this advice has for cattlemen and women, especially concerning natural disasters.

It seems the last two years the number of natural disasters have hit beef producers harder than normal and for those of us in the Gulf Coast region, the main culprit has been hurricanes. While we can't change the tides, we can be prepare and think ahead to ensure as much success as possible when it comes to evacuation and reentering the impacted area after the disaster.

The following interview with Shae' Simon, Executive Vice President for the Louisiana Cattlemen's Association and Tyler Fitzgerald, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension, Agriculture and Natural Resources Agent for Jefferson County, focuses on hurricane preparation, but many of the principles can easily translate to wild fires and the aftermath of a tornado.

For those who aren't directly impacted by a disaster, the need to be aware of opportunities and aid is equally as important.

Regarding natural disaster evacuation, what advice do you have a for a producer?

Fitzgerald: Build a relationship with your local livestock control officer (normally through the sheriff's office). These guys know the area and can help you decide what types of disasters might affect you. They will also be the people checking on animals and assessing the area after any disaster; and they are the ones who have to put up loose livestock off roadways.

Most counties emergency management offices have list serves and warning notices you can sign up to receive as well. Taking that information and having a plan ahead of time can help you know if and when to prepare to evacuate your pets and livestock. Also know your location, elevation, past hazards, and weather events, and know that just because it hasn't happened in your time there doesn't mean it won't happen.

As far as loading out livestock goes,

If you struggle to load and transport your livestock normally, allow yourself more time when preparing for a disaster; things never go well when you are in a hurry.

Larger herds cannot be hauled in just a few trailer loads and may need to be moved to other pastures down a road by means of a cattle drive. If this is the case, make sure you do not impede local residents from evacuating and that you can conduct this drive safely.

Lastly, the Texas Extension Disaster Education Network website has many educational publications that are useful in preparing and the aftermath of disasters (texashelp.tamu.edu).

Simon: Regardless if you stay or if you evacuate, you need a backup plan. Touch base with friends regularly to see if you can evacuate to their property if a storm hits that season.

If you evacuated, fill up the gas tanks on all your equipment and trucks before coming back to the area. Many gas stations won't be open or will have a shortage when you get near the storm location and having filled gas cans from your evacuation location will help you be able to start repairing and working as soon as you arrive.

You also want to evacuate with a chainsaw (and fuel for it) so that when you come back to your property, you are able to cut through any down trees and fences that block you and your truck (or your livestock).

Is there any way to protect livestock/equipment/facilities left behind?

Simon: If you are aware of 99% of your flood plains, then I recommend leaving your equipment in the middle of a pasture where you don't anticipate floods. Once the barn comes down in the disaster, you won't be able to get to the tractor to start fixing everything else that is broke, so having your equipment in the open and away from trees will help in the aftermath.

If you leave livestock behind, ensure they are away from potential flood areas, or at least make it easy for them to get to safety if it were to flood (cut fences, open gates). I never recommend leaving livestock in barns for the same reason you don't leave a tractor in the barn – in the event of a collapse, you don't want your animals trapped.

Above all, ensure there is a fresh water source for those left behind. If your water runs on a well or power, you need a backup plan to draw fresh water.

Fitzgerald: Everyone's situation is different and every disaster is different. If you leave your animals where you think they are safe, they need to be in an area where they will not be subjected to standing in water for any length of time, in addition to enough food and water for that length of time. You may have to get creative about the water source. If you have a small number of cattle or horses, used syrup tubs can hold water. For larger herds, an old aluminum

boat or anything clean and safe that can hold water will work.

Branding and identification is so important for evacuated livestock and those left behind. This not only helps prevent theft, but helps in the event fences are down and livestock get separated.

When assessing the damage, what should producers be aware of?

Simon: Producers need to be mindful of the parasites and diseases that come with flood waters. For instance, when Hurricane Ida hit in August 2021, there was a need to ensure your herds were vaccinated after the fact for anaplasmosis as this disease was prevalent in that area and then spread by the storm. Due to the costs of this vaccine, I wouldn't have recommended it before the storm, but afterwards, it was a crucial need for producers and we wanted to make sure producers had access quickly to it.

A heavy deworming program before and after a hurricane, along with a good herd health management program will go a long way. After a storm of this nature, the grass will die and cattle will be eating forage much closer to the ground and picking up more parasites and a solid foundation will also help them combat the stress of the storm.

Fitzgerald: Always take pictures and document any losses while you are assessing your property and livestock after an event. This is for insurance or any USDA (livestock indemnity program) disaster programs that might come out. Each disaster is different and each has hazards associated with them. Always remember your own safety while dealing with disaster areas. Know your own comfort levels and be cautious of debris and water, contaminated waters from flood and diseases that normally come from animals that are subjected stress during an event. ★
