Mighty Grateful


have heard a picture is worth a thousand words. As I look at this photograph and see the story it tells, I'm not sure a thousand is enough.

Our family owned business received this postcard as a thank you note from one of the exhibitors who participated in the 2024 SandHills Stock Show and Rodeo. This program provides an opportunity for boys and girls all over the state to bring their 4-H and FFA Heifer, Steer or Lamb projects to participate in competitions that evaluate their work in feeding, grooming and showing their animals. Their year-long investment of time, work and money is rewarded with learning responsibility, accountability, dependability and character building. The kids learn to take risks and get out of their comfort zone to challenge themselves. They gain experience that will benefit them as they continue through school, their career, and life in general.

A further look at the picture, and you see there are two major industries represented on this postcard: Agriculture and Oil & Gas. 






New Program to Benefit **Hereford Breeders** and Youth

Per the Texas Cattle Feeders Association (TCFA) site: The TCFA Junior Fed Beef Challenge was designed to encourage young people to gain practical experience in feeding commercial beef cattle. This program stresses the importance of proper animal husbandry and financial management. Over the last 25 years, TCFA has introduced hundreds of young people to the cattle feeding industry through the Junior Fed Beef Challenge.

A new program for our junior members has been developed and ap-proved by the Texas Hereford Association Executive Committee. The THA is teaming up with the TCFA and will be adding in award monies for three different divisions developed by THA. The three divisions for the steers will be 1) Registered Herefords 2) Commercial Hereford (at least 50% Hereford) and 3) Black or Red Baldy. The junior must be a TJHA member.

The established rules for the TCFA program will be followed and then the THA Foundation will add in the monies for qualifying steers. Things to note:

- Calves are spring born calves
- Weaned in Sept / Oct @ 450 + lbs.
- Usually run on wheat pasture until March
- At March entry date calves should be weighing 8 - 900 lbs.
- Calves can be fed at home or a feedlot
- At mid July delivery / slaughter steers are going to weigh about 1400 lbs.

Find complete information on the TCFA website and click on the youth tab. Breeders need to consider the advantage of selling your steers to these participants that will help promote your genetics. he 2025 National Hereford Show, to be held at the Fort Worth Stock Show & Rodeo, Fort Worth, Texas on Feb. 3rd will be named in memory of Jarold Callahan, an icon across the beef industry and a leader in many arenas at the time of his passing in December 2023.



Callahan grew up on a diversified farm and cattle operation in northeastern Oklahoma, where his passion for agriculture emerged at an early agehe was on a tractor as soon as, or perhaps even before, his father would let him. He earned a bachelor's degree in animal science from Oklahoma State University (OSU), graduating in 1976 as one of the OSU Top Ten Seniors in the College of Agriculture. As a standout member of the 1975 OSU Livestock Judging Team, he achieved impressive rankings, including second high individual overall at both Fort Worth and Houston, and third at Chicago.

Callahan's involvement in the cattle industry spans commercial cow-calf production, stocker/yearlings, cattle finishing, and the purebred sector. He began his career coaching the livestock judging team and leading the Northeastern Oklahoma A&M Agriculture Division from 1976 to 1982, during which he also completed a master's degree in agriculture (animal science) from the University of Arkansas. He returned to OSU in 1982 and served as an instructor and livestock judging team coach, earning a promotion to assistant professor in 1990.

In 1991, he became the Oklahoma Cattlemen's Association (OCA) Executive Vice President, where he boosted membership, expanded producer outreach, and established the OCA Foundation. In 1996, he joined Express Ranches, Yukon, Oklahoma as presi-

dent, and would lead that organization for 27 years until his death. Express Ranches would become the largest purebred seedstock operation in North America with both Angus and Hereford genetics. Under his leadership, the program would grow to marketing over 1,500 bulls and 1,200 females each year and receive the American Angus Association Roll of Victory as the high-point breeder for double digit years. Additionally, Callahan, his wife Jennifer, and son Ryan run Callahan Cattle Company.

His career demonstrates a lifelong dedication to agricultural advancement and beef industry improvement, marked by a focus on industry standards and the evolution of tools like genomics in cattle production.

His leadership extends across various organizations, including serving on the American Angus Association Board of Directors from 2004 to 2012, where he was president in his final year. He was appointed by former Oklahoma Governor Mary Fallins as the Vice Chair of the OSU Board of Regents and previously served on the Oklahoma Beef Council Board from 2002 to 2008. Just a few weeks prior to his death, he was inducted into the Saddle & Sirloin Portrait Gallery.

The THA Is proud to name this year's national show for Callahan and honor the contributions he made to the beef industry in pastures, board rooms and classrooms.★

had Breeding, Miami, Texas, was named the new president of the American Hereford Association (AHA) during the Annual Membership Meeting Oct. 26, in Kansas City, Mo. After graduating high school in 1988, he attended Texas A&M University.

Breeding returned home to the family operation, which markets about 100 Hereford bulls and 50 replacement females annu-

ally. Breeding's love for the Hereford breed

flourished when he returned home, as he started breeding cows and working in the show barn. Breeding's knowledge, gleaned from his father, William, gave him the ability to compete with show cattle on a national level, while also producing beef cattle with the genetic merit the market demands. Through the continued use of AI and embryo transfer (ET), the B&C brand is trusted across the country for sound, functional cattle that work in the showring and excel in the pasture.

While they sell a few show heifers, the majority of their cattle are sold to the commercial producer, mostly to Brahman cattlemen who produce the sought after F1 tigerstripes, known as the maternal queen of the South.

Breeding and his wife, Erin, have five children — Austin, Blayke, Wyatt, Lillian and Blair. Fatherhood emphasized the importance of family and the value of passing down honesty, an outstanding work ethic and a better life. After returning to Miami, a small town in the Texas Panhandle, Breeding became active in the community. He was elected to the city council in November of 2005. He has been the Miami mayor since 2009. He also serves on the board of trustees of the First Christian Church. Breeding is an active member of the Texas Hereford Association, serving on the board since 2011, including stints as president in 2016 and 2017. ★

2024 NJHA Fed Steer Shootout Winners Recognized in Kansas City

he National Junior Hereford Association (NJHA) Fed Steer Shootout teaches young people about the cattle feeding industry. HRC Feed Yards LLC, Scott City, Kan., hosts the annual event. This year the Fed Steer Shootout attracted 72 junior participants in 20 states — from California to Pennsylvania — which entered 211 head of Hereford and Hereford-influenced steers. The 2024 winners received more than \$15,000 in cash prizes and awards from the Hereford Youth Foundation of America (HYFA) on Oct. 25 during the American Hereford Association (AHA) Annual Membership Meeting and Conference in Kansas City, Mo.

Each year, the feedout's cattle performance awards are recognized alongside the top three junior members, in both the junior and senior age divisions, for their efforts and knowledge of the cattle feeding industry. Those top three participants in each age division gave a speech and were interviewed by a panel of judges to determine the final placing.

Contestants collected feedyard performance and carcass data on their pen of three and individual entries of Hereford and commercial Hereford-influenced steers, while gaining comprehensive industry knowledge on topics such as animal health, nutrition and marketing. All steers were fed at HRC Feed Yards, Scott City, Kan., and were hauled to and harvested at National Beef Packing Co.






