

Conference participants enjoyed several unique learning opportunities during the event including:

- An up-close look into Allflex USA Inc., and how their technology and data-driven solutions are shaping the industry.
- Livestock handling and processing presented by the Texas Christian University (TCU) Ranch Management program.
- Beef Quality Assurance and vaccination protocols presented by Merck Animal Health USA.

For the first time, the conference included Bridging the Gap, a unique career learning and networking event which also takes place during the annual Junior National Hereford Expo. It included representatives from 14 agricultural companies and universities.

"Faces of Leadership is a tool to not only build leaders, but to get these young people started on a successful career path. We hope they stay in agriculture, but whatever industry they land in after college, we want them to be armed with the knowledge and the skill sets to be successful," says Amy Cowan, American Hereford Association Director of Youth Activities and Foundation.

Participants also had ample opportunity for fun, including time in the historic Fort Worth Stockyards, a visit to the Cowboy Channel studio and a customized tour of Globe Life Field where the Texas Rangers play.

once owned by ranching dynasty lists for \$6M

The 5,000-acre Anchor Land & Cattle ranch was once among the holdings of Texas' iconic Kokernot family.

nearly 5,000-acre West Texas ranch, property that reportedly once belonged to Texas' famous Kokernot ranching family, was put on the market earlier this year for \$6.36 million.

Located just outside of Alpine in Brewster County (Texas' largest county by area and among its least densely populated), Anchor Land & Cattle is a working ranch that the listing says is suited for both grazing and hunting. The natural environment of the sprawling acreage, listed by Republic Ranches, is comprised of rolling grasslands as well as "commanding" views of nearby mountains such as Mitre Peak, Henderson Mesa, and the Davis and Barilla ranges.

Mitre Peak is also reportedly visible from one of the more famous ranches in the region, according to a recent article in the Cenizo Journal, the Kokernot O6 ranch. The Kokernot family first came to America in 1818, and descendants of the original continued on page 20

arrivals moved to Texas just a few years later. Different sources place the registration of the O6 brand at different points in time, but seem to agree that the ranch was well established in Brewster and Jeff Davis counties by about a decade into the 20th century, and is still managed by descendants of the original Kokernots today. At its peak, the ranch was as large as half a million acres across three counties, according to the Texas State Historical Society. The family was listed earlier this year as the 40th largest landowner in the U.S., with 278,000 acres under its heirs.

Anchor Land & Cattle was once part of the family's holdings, the listing notes, and like the historic property nearby, is still home to active ranching operations as well as local wildlife and hunting opportunities.

That wildlife—including dove, javelina and waterfowl—is fed by the pieces of Alpine and Moss creeks that cross the acreage as well as treated water that leaves the local water treatment facility and a number of wells.

The built environment at Anchor Land & Cattle is more modest, in keeping with the area's history. The property includes a 3,400-square-foot barndomimium that has both living quarters and garage space as well as horse pens and troughs and a shooting range. ★



Douglas D. "Doug" Bennett

Douglas D. Bennett of Echo, OR passed away August 18, 2024, at the age of 91. Doug and twin brother Don were born May 8, 1933, to J.W. and Marie Bennett born on a cattle and wheat ranch in Winona, WA, the twins quickly followed the lead of their two older brothers Bill and Jack



and the vision of J.W. and Marie continued.

Doug graduated high school and served in the Navy for 2 years; in 1953 he married Gladys Hudson. With the GI bill and a growing family, Doug heads to Pullman to attend Washington State University. Upon graduation from WSU in 1960 he goes on to manage Lehn Bros. Herefords. During that time Doug purchased his first registered Herefords. He returns to Washington State to earn a master's degree, teach animal science, and coach the livestock judging team. In 1967 Doug had the opportunity to join Howard Stone and manage Stone Hereford Ranch. He was able to continue to build his private herd with a unique agreement he had with Howard Stone. Stone Herefords became one of the premier Hereford operations both in the show ring and production sales.

In 1976 brought the record setting dispersion sale of Stone Hereford Ranch with a cowherd selling for \$2.2 million. The highlight of the sale was SR Big Arthur H201who brought \$180,000 for ½ interest and sold to John Wayne and Louis Johnson of 26 Bar Ranch. On the conclusion of the dispersal, Doug & Don purchased Stone Hereford Ranch then renamed it to Oregon Hereford Ranch. And... Doug's vision continued

In 1979, Doug expanded by joining Sam Friedman to form Lone Star Hereford Ranch in Texas. Lone Star was quickly on the map with two Grand Champion bulls at the National Western in Denver as well as seven Grand Champion carloads, and two Reserve Grand Champion carloads in Denver. The show program was strong with several champions at major shows. Doug's mission was to produce high quality herd bulls to sell in their annual production sale as well as in Denver. Lone Star was one of the first herds to ultrasound yearly cattle for ribeye, marbling, and fat thickness as criteria for selection.

Doug initiated many programs for youth which included the Texoma Beef Clinic and the Lone Star Heifer Futurity Show. The Texoma Beef Clinic brought over 700 par-

ticipants to evaluate several classes of Hereford cattle. The Lone Star Heifer Futurity Show became a yearly event that provided an opportunity to showcase progeny purchased at Lone Star Hereford Ranch.

After the sale of Lone Star Herefords, Doug returns to his beloved Northwest and joined brother Don at Oregon Hereford Ranch. They dispersed the Hereford cowherd in the fall to devote more time to their 4,000 head feedlot. Not ready to retire yet, Doug and Don purchased an Angus cowherd. They started selling bulls in Madras, Oregon with Greg Lechner forming many new friendships. In 2007 they sell the feedlot and a large portion of the ranch while retaining the main headquarters. In their final years Doug & Don reduced their cowherd to a few head and sold the headquarters to grandson Jordan.

He was inducted into the American Hereford Association Hall of Merit in 2008.

Doug is survived by his children: Doug (Kris) Bennett, Susan (Joe) Parks, Randy (Vanessa) Bennett, Mitch (Becky) Bennett as well as several grandchildren and great grandchildren, nieces, and nephews. ★

Kenneth Ray Larson

Kenneth Ray Larson was born September 15, 1937 to Lee and Allene Larson who were Hereford cattle raisers and sharecroppers in Clifton, Texas. He passed away on August 7, 2024 at the age of 86.



Kenneth attended school in Clifton from first grade until he graduated from Clifton High School in 1956 as president of his class. While in Clifton, he was very active in FFA and recognized as one of the Top Ten FFA boys receiving the Santa Fe Award.

After high school, Kenneth attended Baylor University where he graduated in 1961 with a B.S. in Physical Education and a split minor in Education and Psychology.

His pursuit led him to Big Spring ISD in the spring of 1961 where he taught students and ran the Big Spring YMCA as the Youth Director of summer activities. His impact on young people had begun, and the legend of "Mr. Larson", as we respectfully and lovingly addressed him, was born. In September of 1961, Dallas ISD hired him as a physical education teacher. Mr. Larson always said that 30 students were on his class roll, but close to 100 students would show up for his class. on time and worked hard, they could stay. And stay they did!

In 1967, during 12 years of service in Dallas ISD, Mr. Larson married Carolyn Stegemueller, a graduate of Blinn College and the University of Texas at Austin. Their family grew with the birth of 2 children, Lee and Kelle.

In the fall of 1972, because of his belief that the educational system could offer so much more, Mr. and Mrs. Larson founded DeSoto Private School, Mr. Larson's mission in 1972 was to provide a top-quality private school education at an affordable price for working parents. He found a vacant church in DeSoto, and with hard work and sacrifice, the renovation began and the DPS legacy was born. Over the years, the school evolved into a nationally accredited private school for children ages three through sixth grade. It was a rare occurrence to ever find a day that Mr. Larson was not at DeSoto Private School impacting students' lives. Mr. Larson's educational philosophy of discipline and structure, grounded in love, created a successful learning program that has served thousands of children and their families over the years.

Returning to his roots, Mr. Larson established the Larson Running L Ranch in the city of his birth, Clifton, Texas. Mr. Larson raised nationally recognized, award-winning Polled Hereford cattle. After returning to the United States, Kathleen worked for Nancy Reagan at the White House in the first Reagan Administration. She then went to work for the National Cattlemen's Association as Director of Private Lands and Environment.

Kathleen married Beau Brite White on August 13, 1993 in Midland. In their 31 years of marriage they shared many wonderful adventures. They originally lived on the Brite Ranch, a 130-year old Hereford family ranching operation located in Presidio County in far West Texas. Later they moved to Bastrop County to be near Austin for Kathleen's growing career in politics and policy.

Throughout their marriage, they raised world class Jack Russell Terriers, attending many shows and hunts around the US and also in the UK. They won many regional and national awards including the National Jack Russell championship six times

Somehow always finding time to be social, Kathleen was a superlative cook and loved to host and entertain people. Everyone was made to feel welcome and special at the table with her and Beau.




