



New Program to Benefit Hereford Breeders and Youth








Per the Texas Cattle Feeders Association (TCFA) site: The TCFA Junior Fed Beef Challenge was designed to encourage young people to gain practical experience in feeding commercial beef cattle. This program stresses the importance of proper animal husbandry and financial management. Over the last 25 years, TCFA has introduced hundreds of young people to the cattle feeding industry through the Junior Fed Beef Challenge.

A new program for our junior members has been developed and approved by the Texas Hereford Association Executive Committee. The THA is teaming up with the TCFA and will be adding in award monies for three different divisions developed by THA. The three divisions for the steers will be 1) Registered Herefords 2) Commercial Hereford (at least 50% Hereford) and 3) Black or Red Baldy. The junior must be a TJHA member.

The established rules for the TCFA program will be followed and then the THA Foundation will add in the monies for qualifying steers. Things to note:

- Calves are spring born calves
- Weaned in Sept / Oct @ 450 + lbs.
- Usually run on wheat pasture until March
- · At March entry date calves should be weighing 8 - 900 lbs.
- · Calves can be fed at home or a feedlot.
- At mid July delivery / slaughter steers are going to weigh about 1400 lbs.

Find complete information on the TCFA website and click on the youth tab. Breeders need to consider the advantage of selling your steers to these participants that will help promote your genetics. when you began driving a car or truck.

Despite the lack of resources for livestock trailer safety measures, the need for education is imperative.

Dr. Clyde Lane, Jr., now retired professor emeritus from the University of Tennessee Department of Animal Science, once stated that because the stock trailer is such an essential piece of equipment on most livestock operations, understanding the principles of proper cattle transportation is important for cattlemen. He went on to say that the main focus of hauling with a truck and trailer, especially when it is full of cattle, is safety.

"We want to do everything we can to make it safe on the road and to ensure that others can see the stock trailer. You would be surprised how many noncompliant trailers are on the roads," Lane said.

Lane suggests that before you even go to the trailer and start loading that you first visit with your insurance agent. Your policy might cover your cattle trailer in the event of an accident, but if hauling someone else's cattle, then only the truck may be covered and so forth. It is also good to know exactly how the insurance company views

your truck and trailer unit (as one unit or separate).

If you don't know what you don't know (due to the lack of education that many have in regards to trailer safety), then you are most likely going to be in a reactive verses preventative state when it comes to proper and compliant safety measures for your load.

Safety begins in the buying process. Consider your trailer needs and how many animals you will usually haul and determine the proper size trailer. All too often a trailer is tasked with carrying a load beyond the recommended capacity/weight limits.

Other factors that contribute to safety when selecting a trailer include loading ramps and non-slip floors. Then once your trailer is properly selected, your towing vehicle should also be considered. Just because the trailer is big enough to haul a certain number of head, doesn't mean the truck is up for the task. Find out the gross combined vehicle weight of the tow vehicle to learn the amount of weight it can safely haul. This includes the weight of the trailer, your animals, any passengers, and cargo.

Lane pointed out that in the event of an accident where the truck and trailer weights were over the specified limits, it would be difficult and nearly impossible to win a lawsuit even if the truck driver was not at fault for the accident.

The air pressures of tires should be looked at next and inflated to the recommended pressure found printed on the sidewall.

To measure tread depth, Lane said to put a penny down inside the tread with Lincoln's head facing down and as you look across the flat surface of the tread, determine if all of Lincoln's head is showing. If the entire head is showing the tread is worn down too much to be safely used he said.

Tires may look like they are in great condition, but the age of the tire is also important. "Look at the DOT number on the sidewall of the tire. The last four digits of the number indicate the week and year that the tire was manufactured. It is recommended that tires over seven years of age be replaced regardless of the tire appearance. Many times the older tires may not show signs of structural breakdown," Lane shared.

It's not time to hit the road yet.

Before you take off, it is wise to create an extensive list of inspections. The obvious checks include testing the turn signals, brake lights and tail lights and measuring

tire thread and air pressure, but it recommended to take your inspections a step further. Begin by making sure the trailer floor is clean and rust-free with a recommended rubber matt, that no sharp objects are jutting out from any place to injure your animal, and that the electrical connections and wiring are in good condition.

Additional steps include double checking latches and safety chains and cables between the truck and trailer are fastened securely, that the ball is the correct size for the trailer, that any trailer over 1,000 pounds has its own brake system and ensuring lug nuts are properly tightened.


When you are ready to start loading your livestock, remember to bring the bumper of the trailer as low to the ground as possible to create ease for the animals and inspect them all to ensure they are fit to travel and provide them water before they are loaded to ensure hydration ahead of the trip. Avoid loading your livestock too early, which increases the stress placed on them and try to keep like sized animals in the compartments of the trailer. For

your animals' safety, do not allow them to hang their heads out of the trailer, where they could be injured by flying objects.

As you head out, check the weather ahead of you and avoid locking the trailer. In the event of an accident, a lock will slow down rescue workers from being able to assist and attend to your livestock.

It goes without saying that the driver should remain alert, using a safe speed and keep their headlights on, but it is also recommended to stay in one lane as much as possible. By avoiding lane changes, the safety of the trip is increased. As a reminder, when your braking time increases when you are towing a full trailer, so it is recommended to maintain a safe distance from the vehicle in front of you and leave adequate room to stop.

With the right set of inspections, knowledge and awareness, your trips can have the right foundation for a safe departure and return. While the road is unpredictable, your truck and trailer are your responsibility and demand your attention and inspections. ★

ebruary and the winter show season is well underway in Texas. Nothing says a Texas major like bigger-thanlife cinnamon rolls, a Cowboy Burrito cooked over a large iron skillet, and warm, hearty food served in the stalls to your hungry kids, family, crews, and neighbors.

For over the past thirty years, our family at Nolan Herefords was right there with so many other families spending early mornings and late nights in the barns preparing our Hereford cattle for the major shows that are so competitive and rewarding in our state for more than the awards. We taught our girls, like all of you did, that winning started in the pasture and barn at home and that life lessons were well learned there and on the show road, as well as in the barns and show ring. We enjoyed spending an immense amount of time with our girls, fellow juniors, and breeders while at these shows and felt a huge kinship with our Hereford family. We laughed, cheered, fed each other's bellies and spirits, and most especially raised our kids with hard work and love for one another, friends, and fellow showmen, even when they beat you in the ring.

For years, it was my job to be what I called the 'puff and fluff' of the family dynamics making sure our family was ready for shows, dressed, packed, and fed well while on these sometimes more than week-long trips. I took this job to heart and not only fed my family

The Ranch Kitchen's Beefy Goulash

INGREDIENTS:

2 pounds ground beef, browned (cooked until all pink is gone), drained

- 1 10 fluid ounce can(s) Rotel Tomatoes with Green Chili's & Cilantro 1 onion, chopped
- 1 12.5 fluid ounce can(s) stewed tomatoes or fresh cut in to chunks
- 4 6 cup(s) water I usually just use the stewed tomato can and fill up with water 4 times and add to the pot after putting in the tomatoes
- 2 3 cup(s) elbow macaroni or bowtie pasta I use Barilla or Skinners only!
- 1/4 cup(s) sugar (optional) but I think this makes the dish wonderful
- 1 teaspoon Tony Chachere's Creole Seasoning
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 2 teaspoon chili powder
- 1 teaspoon garlic salt or fresh, minced garlic to cut down on salt
- 1/2 to a whole green bell pepper or green chilis, chopped (optional) I sometimes use banana peppers
- 1/4 pound(s) Velvetta Cheese (processed cheese block) or fresh grated cheddar cheese

INSTRUCTIONS:

Brown ground beef and onion in a nonstick Teflon coated pan.

Drain all left over grease off meat.

Add tomatoes with liquid from both cans.

Add sugar, chili powder, garlic, water, noodles and all remaining spices.

Bring goulash to a boil and then down to a simmer (low heat) and cover with a lid. You may need to add more water depending on how many noodles you add to you pot. I always add the full box. Make sure you have enough water for your noodles to boil in without making this dish a soup. 4 -5 cups of water should be

Cook goulash on low, stirring occasionally until noodles are tender about 20 minutes uncovered, covered if you are in a hurry and they will cook faster.

Add cubed Velvetta Cheese or grated cheese the last 10 minutes or it will stick and mix in well. ***I sometimes leave off the cheese as my husband prefers it that way.

Serve along side The Ranch Kitchen's Italian Green Beans recipe found on my site, a salad, and French bread.

A The Ranch Kitchen Original Recipe 2009 by Alise Nolan https://www.theranchkitchen.com/recipes/main-recipes/detail/id/212 but extended home-cooked-in-the-barns hospitality to our FFA groups, Hereford juniors, and fellow breeders at shows across the nation. Out of that love of cooking and at the constant request of my oldest daughter Ilissa while in her first year at Texas A&M University for recipes from home, my blog The Ranch Kitchen was born in the early days of recipe sharing on the internet way back in 2007. From there the idea for a stand-alone website was born with a fellow friend, Hereford breeder and web developer and family friend Tonya Perez with Perez Herefords of New Mexico while sitting at a Jr. National Hereford Expo. The Ranch Kitchen started cataloging recipes and posts to share more easily with others with her developer and company at Biz Harvest.

Since then The Ranch Kitchen was honored to be featured at the State Fair of Texas as the first featured blogger in their cookbook with a beef recipe I will share with you later in this article; written for the SureChamp VitaFerm blog, Certified Hereford Beef, the Missouri Hereford Association, helped start a recipe page for the National Hereford Women while on their board as President and our family was chosen to be featured as a Certified Hereford Beef family here at Nolan Herefords.


I continue to share my recipes on Facebook, and Instagram and have now added TikTok and the Reels format of short informative 'how to' cooking recipes to my formats as well. The Ranch Kitchen stays true to advocating for beef and our lifestyle in agriculture and was recently chosen by Taste of Home Magazine in 2023 to be part of their Top Chef Contest making it to the Top 5 featuring easy recipes that are tried and true from our ranch to your homes and friends votes.

As a regular feature each month, the Texas Hereford Magazine will start to feature The Ranch Kitchen recipes in their magazine. I am truly humbled to start this series of articles and excited to share not only my recipes but those also of our Texas Juniors who compete in the Certified Hereford Beef Cookoff each summer and in the past at the Junior National Hereford Expositions, as well as recipes from our Hereford friends and cookbooks published from our associations over the years.

This month's recipe has stood the test of time at our ranch and with our Hereford friends. While no recipe was left for me, I practiced on my family until we thought we achieved the perfect 'Texas-style' goulash just like my MeMaw's with just enough gooey cheese to please the kids and adults in the family. While it may not be traditional, it's tried and true, and my most requested recipe from our daughters Ilissa, Bethany, and Audrey and my site The Ranch Kitchen.

I hope you'll enjoy this recipe with your family soon and in the barns by tripling the recipe and serving it in a large roaster pan to share with your friends as well. Some of my greatest Hereford friendships were made over sharing a recipe, large vats of my other semi-famous recipe of Chicken Spaghetti, or some spiced-up pretzels at the end of the day with my husband Scott's friends.
